<p><b>Edited Video</b> is 5-7 minutes, and looks professional and well-planned.</p>	<p>Edited video is 5-7 minutes long, but lacks cohesiveness, and could've endured additional editing.</p>	<p>Edited video is either a minute less or more than the requirement, and scenes could be more cohesive.</p>	<p>Video is significantly less than 5 minute, and didn't undergo appropriate editing for a mini-movie.</p>	<p>Video is less than 1 minute and is not edited at all.</p>

Script lines mostly correspond to the lines in the movie, and show the narrative descriptions.</p>	<p>Script is typed, but doesn't follow requirements for font and spacing. Script lines somewhat correspond to character's lines, but most are ad-libbed or different from movie.</p>	<p>Script is handwritten with grammatical errors, and doesn't correspond to character's lines in the movie.</p>	<p>No script is provided.</p>
<p><b>Script is annotated</b> to show all major plot elements, which are accurate; direct and indirect characterization have been labeled; and the overall theme of the movie has been correctly identified.</p>	<p>Script is annotated, and includes most major plot elements which are correct. Characterization has been labeled, but not all examples are accurate. The overall theme has been correctly identified.</p>	<p>Script is annotated, but doesn't accurately identify the major plot elements and types of characterization The theme hasn't been identified.</p>	<p>The script is not annotated, therefore not identifying any plot elements. However, a theme has been identified.</p>	<p>Script is not annotated for major plot elements or characterization, and the theme of the movie is not identified.</p>
